What is an advocate?

An Advocate is a person trained in addiction or prevention services who is provided through a partnership between Middle Township and Cape Assist. An Advocate is present in the court room for the public to gain information on treatment, assessment, and referrals to community supports. There is no cost to meet with a public advocate.

How can an advocate help me?

If you or a loved one have an alcohol or drug problem and want counseling for yourself, your family, or even just information on treatment options for addictions, a public advocate is able to counsel, inform, and guide you or them through the process of seeking help for alcohol and drug issues.

Where can I find one?

The advocate is available Thursdays from 9am to 3pm
in the Middle Township Municipal Court.
